# THE TXDOT TRAVEL SURVEY

The Texas Department of Transportation is conducting travel surveys in Abilene. These surveys provide information about local travel patterns which will assist planning of future transportation projects.

These travel surveys are broken up into two categories:

## household & establishment

Household surveys recruit residents through postcards mailed out by a contracted vendor, Westat. To participate (and potentially earn a \$10 reward!), you can sign up on their website:

Establishment surveys recruit local businesses through an introductory letter and a follow up phone call by a contracted vendor, ETC institute, to schedule an on-site survey by their trained staff.

# Celebration Safety: How to Thrive When You Shouldn't Drive

The months of March, April, and May are packed full of fun celebrations, such as Spring Break, St. Patrick's Day, Cinco de Mayo, and Memorial Day. Holidays are always enjoyable, but driving under the influence of drugs or alcohol can often turn a good time deadly.

March 17th is St. Patrick's Day, but this holiday doesn't always end with rainbows and pots of gold. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, "In 2019 alone, 57 people were killed in drunk-driving crashes over the St. Patrick's Day period."

Spring Break is a similarly dangerous holiday. The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) reports that "Over last year's spring break, Texas saw 872 DUI-alcohol related traffic crashes. These crashes resulted in 30 fatalities and 107 serious injuries" (Brown).

Memorial Day is rarely as rowdy as Spring Break or St. Patrick's Day, but drunk driving nonetheless remains a problem during this time.



## THE REAL COST OF A DUI IN TEXAS

Apart from death and injury, there are also significant legal and financial costs, as well as other potential consequences for those who choose to drink and drive...

- Up to \$17,000 in fines and fees
- Loss of current employment
- Difficulty finding housing and future employment due to background checks
- Loss of driver's license, and potentially other licenses
- With a felony, loss of right to vote or own a gun

# TIPS TO FIND A SOBER RIDE

## PLAN AHEAD.

Before you start drinking, know how you're getting home. Planning ahead can save you time, money, and even someone's life.



## **USE A RIDESHARE SERVICE.**



Leave your car at home and call a rideshare service to and from the bar. Be prepared by having the rideshare app downloaded on your phone and your phone battery fully charged.

# TAKE TURNS AS A DESIGNATED DRIVER

Whether you're heading out for a night out with buddies or meeting up with coworkers for happy hour, take one vehicle with a designated driver. This will save you on parking fees and ensures your friends will not get behind the wheel after drinking.



Remember, the designated driver is the one who has not consumed any alcohol.

## **CALL A FRIEND FOR HELP.**



Friends and family members are a good option for a sober ride home. A call asking for a ride home is much better than a call asking to be bailed out of jail after getting a DWI.



## DON'T DRINK.

No matter the case, don't feel like you have to drink to enjoy your evening out, especially if you know you'll be driving yourself home.

## TALK TO YOUR BARTENDER.

Ask the bartender to secure you a sober ride home. Bar staff are happy to help their customers get home safely, and some will help ensure your car is still there in the morning

Drinking and driving is never safe, even when going back to a house that is "just a few streets down." If possible, ask to sleep on a friend's couch until the alcohol has worn off.

## **RANDY WILLIAMS**

TAYLOR COUNTY COMMISSIONER

Randall D. Williams is the Taylor County Commissioner for Precinct 1. He received his B.S. in Administration of Justice from California State College in 1979. He worked with the county's juvenile justice department for 28 years before beginning his first term as Commissioner in 2008. Williams is currently in the midst of his fourth consecutive term. He has been married to his wife, Gaye Lynn, for over 41 years, and together they have three kids and seven grandkids. During the most recent 2020 election, Williams was quoted as saying: "Being a commissioner is the most rewarding job I have ever held" (Bethel).

An advisory committee may provide technical analysis, specialized knowledge, and citizen input on specific issues. The technical advisory committee may recommend specific strategies or projects to the MPO Policy Board. It is common for an MPO to have a Technical Advisory Committee and Citizen Advisory Committee, and to have subcommittees on specific issues such as system performance, environmental justice, bicycle issues, and travel demand modeling.

## WHAT'S MAPPENING?

## A CLOSER LOOK AT THE TXDOT STATEWIDE PLANNING MAP

The "Maps" tab on the Abilene MPO website is your one-stop-shop to learn more about transportation in the Abilene area. In this issue of the Abilene MPO Insider, we're looking at the TxDOT Statewide Planning Map. Read more to discover what kind of information is available and how to interpret the data.

The capabilities of the TxDOT Statewide Planning Map are vast and varied. Not only can you visualize and compare data from different categories, but you can even sketch and estimate costs for potential transportation projects. With the exception of transportation professionals, most of us on a day-to-day basis have no need to plan roadway reconstruction projects. However, the information that can be found in the 50 different map overlays is both interesting and useful. Let's explore a few of the many types of data available, and see how this information can be used to more fully understand how we as Texans get from Point A to Point B.



## First, a word from TxDOT:

The Statewide Planning Map displays data in support of planning operations at TxDOT.

## NAVIGATING THE STATEWIDE PLANNING MAP

In the last issue of the *Insider*, we discussed all the tools available in the ARCGIS System in-depth, including layers and the map legend. Each of these details is also present in the TxDOT Statewide Planning Map. Use the exercises below to familiarize yourself with the map overlays and to try your hand using the ARCGIS tools. *Before beginning, make sure all overlays are cleared and the basemap is set to the default* "TxDOT."


